

Upcoming Sermon Series: A Biblical Way to Handle Conflict

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ: Our lord and Savior Jesus Christ dwells within and among us. Since, among other titles, he is the Prince of Peace; The Peacemaker between God and humans. Since He is our Peace. Since he proclaimed Peace, and continues to proclaim the Gospel of Peace through us, his Church. And because He said that those who work at making peace shall have the Blessing of being called Sons/Daughters of God...So we could say that it is "natural" for us who benefit from the Peace that God has made with us to extend that Peace to others, especially to the fellow members of our congregation. But because of the challenges of the world, the flesh, and the devil, conflict happens and we forget whose we are and deal with conflict as if Jesus were Not involved...as if we have to either avoid it at all costs or we have to attack the other guy....as if we were more concerned with our own Glory than God's! But there is a Better, God-Honoring, Neighbor-Blessing, and Christ-like Character-Building Way! And that is what this sermon-series will be about: learning to use the Resources of God's Grace available to EACH ONE OF US!

Sunday, Aug.1 : What Conflict is and Three Ways We Deal with it....Two of which are natural to us. One of which is Spirit -Powered and God-Ordained

Aug. 15 : Step 1: Glorify God: How can I please and honor God in this situation?

Aug. 29: Step 2: Get the Log out of your own eye: How can I show Jesus's work in me by taking responsibility for MY contribution to this conflict?

Sept. 5: Step 3: Gently Restore: How can I lovingly serve others by helping them take responsibility for their contribution to this conflict?

Sept. 19: Step 4: Go and Be Reconciled: How can i demonstrate the forgiveness of God and encourage a reasonable solution to this conflict?

- We will send out a message saying that we will be livestreaming sporadically when we have volunteers available.
- Pastor Asplin will come to one of our council meetings (possibly September) to discuss the future of our church.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION AND YOUTH GROUP:

- Hailey will continue to try to reach out to the youth group for a bonfire at the church.
- We will not be having Sunday School this year.

FELLOWSHIP:

- We will have a picnic after church on August 15th. The church will supply the hot dogs and the beverages.
- We will speak about having a soup sale in October.

Worship Services

Each of you are invited to review the precautions that Good Shepherd is implementing and determine if returning to in-person worship is reasonable for you and your situation. We also ask for understanding among our Good Shepherd family for those whose decisions about returning may be different from our own.

As you consider what will be your best option for worship, please keep in mind that Good Shepherd continues to live-stream the Sunday Morning worship service virtually.

The precautions to be implemented for resuming in-person worship are as follows:

• All are asked to wear masks while inside the building. We will wear masks to protect each other.

• Social distancing is expected to be maintained. Pews will be taped off to help maintain social distance. Additionally, we ask that worshippers sit in the same pew as they return to worship in subsequent weeks. Pews will be marked with names to aid in this. Space will also be identified for visitors.

- Singing and corporate speaking will be allowed because of the expectations for masks to be worn and distance to be maintained.
- Hymnals, paper, pencils, etc. will be removed from the pews. However, Bulletins containing Liturgy and hymns will be distributed.

• Doors will be opened so that each person will not need to open the doors. This will reduce touching of a common surface. Entry and exit will be through the main entrance and through the side parking lot entrance.

• A hand sanitizing station will be centrally located in the narthex. Worshippers are encouraged to use this station as they enter the worship space. Other items normally in the narthex will be removed to discourage congregating in this space before or after worship.

• The worship leader will take care of the readings as well as the lighting and extinguishing of the candles. There will be no lector or acolyte taking care of these items.

• Passing the peace will remain corporate, no individual sharing of the peace.

• An offering plate will be placed in a central location. The offering plates will not be passed. Electronic giving through Zelle is encouraged.

• Rather than providing a paper prayer list in the narthex, time will be included in the Prayers of Intercession for people to offer their petitions silently or aloud.

• Holy Communion: upon entering the Sanctuary, you will find small bags containing wafers and lidded cups containing wine on a table at the rear of the church. Please take these with you to your seats. You will not be asked to come up to the altar for communion.

• A record of who attended each weekly worship service will be maintained. In the event that someone determines that they have COVID-19, this will allow the people who could have been exposed to be notified.

In addition to these precautions, we ask that anyone who is not feeling well or is experiencing fever or other symptoms of illness, please remain home so as to protect your neighbor. *We recognize that things, both in and out of our control, could change. Should any changes be made, this will be communicated as quickly as possible*.
