Mission Work Continues...

Although we might not be worshiping in person together yet, the work of the church continues to be done through us. We have donated from our congregation to many local, national and global causes to support those less fortunate during these difficult times. A whopping \$1,170.00 was sent to Synod for their COVID Relief fund. Another \$330 was collected for the Global Barnyard Project which is enough to purchase 5 piglets, 3 goats and 3 flocks of chicks. (We donated the money on match-your-donation day so in reality your offerings will be doubled which will double the number of animals purchased.) Earlier this year, we supported the City Rescue Mission with food and money and sent money to support Camp Lutherlyn. Our church angel, Diana Braun, is still behind the scenes gathering supplies for local organizations. Currently, we are collecting additional money for the City Rescue Mission and have partnered with the New Castle Cancer Support Group that helps those battling cancer on their own. We were able to give ten \$25 gift cards to the Cancer Support Group to help them with needs at Thanksgiving. Hopefully, we can continue to build on this relationship in the future.

In our own congregation, members have died and we have reached out to their grieving families and have supported them. Although limited by the restrictions in place in response to the rising numbers of COVID cases, we have still found ways to offer help. We also gave gifts to our graduates this year.

Members and neighbors have reached out to us for space and we found creative ways to help following the COVID-19 guidelines.

There are so many needs in this community and beyond. If you are in need, reach out and let us know by calling the church office. Pray that we may continue to find ways to bless others as much as we have been blessed! I recently read a commentary that said that they felt the church was dying because people don't see the JOY in being a Christian. When I turned over the gift cards to the local support group, I was asked how we could give so much when we are but a small group of people. The answer was easy. We find JOY in giving. Thank you for the donations you have made so far this year that allow all of these good things to happen so that others may see what a JOY it is to be a Christian! - Ruth

Council Highlights – Meeting held November 10, 2020

- This meeting was held virtually via Zoom
- Approved a motion that we will begin in-person worship at Good Shepherd on Sunday, December 6, 2020, provided that:
 - 1. We are able to obtain a supply pastor.
 - 2. The necessary clean up related to our recent fire has been completed.
 - 3. The boiler and heating system have passed inspection.
 - 4. We are able to meet COVID-19 pandemic mandates and guidelines in effect at that time.
- Approved a motion that we will have an in-person Christmas Eve worship service at Good Shepherd on Thursday, December 24, 2020, with a limit of approximately 68 people who have signed up by December 20, provided that we are able to obtain a supply pastor. The motion carried with two abstentions. (68 people is only an estimate)
- Approved a motion that our staff (K'rin, Evy, and Grover) will return to their regular full-time hours on November 29 if we will be able to begin in-person worship on December 6, and their full-time hours will continue on a week-to-week basis if we continue to be open for in-person worship. The motion carried with two abstentions.
- Ruth Johns prepared a budget proposal for 2021 for Good Shepherd. Some of the figures for this
 budget will not be available until after the Synod Assembly is held this month. Also, until we would
 know a pastor's age, sex, and family situation, the figure for health care can't be determined.
- A motion was made and approved the we accept the proposed budget for 2021 and use it as our working budget until we are able to have a congregational meeting.
- Approved a motion that our Advent offering be the same as the November and December mission project, which is the City Rescue Mission.
- Approved a motion to allow Karen Esposito, who is a neighbor of Good Shepherd, to use Shepherd Center for a Homeowner Association meeting on a weeknight in December.
