Friends,

On the night of Dec. 10 and early morning of Dec. 11, an outbreak of at least 30 tornadoes swept through six states. So far, 94 people are reported dead across five states, more than 80 of those in Kentucky. For those unaccounted for, search-and-rescue operations are underway. Homes and businesses were destroyed, and over 300,000 people were without electricity.

Lutheran Disaster Response is collaborating with the Indiana-Kentucky Synod and other partners in the area to assess the damage and develop an immediate and a long-term response plan. Your gifts to support these response efforts will empower our partners to meet survivors' immediate and long-term needs. Given the extent of the damage, recovery will take years as thousands of homes will need to be rebuilt or repaired. With your support, Lutheran Disaster Response can accompany survivors on the long road to recovery.

Council Highlights - Meeting held January 11, 2022

- This meeting was held virtually via Zoom.
- These minutes will be approved at the February Council Meeting.

CHURCH MATTERS:

- Hailey Hughes made the motion to elect Shirley Mazzocca as President and Keith Kuttesch as Vice President of the church council pending the congregational meeting. Ruth Johns seconded. The motion carried.
- Boiler Inspection Update: The inspector found the boiler in good shape. He remarked that the one side of the storage room in the fellowship hall was inaccessible to the electrical panels due to the amount of stored materials.
- The sound system was looked at and the volume was significantly louder afterwards. The company offered to come back and adjust the speaker to Pastor Goetze's voice.
- We will vote on a color for the metal roof at the church congregational meeting.
- We will omit a midweek lenten service, but we will still have Ash Wednesday, Maundy Thursday, and Good Friday services. Pastor will look into whether or not St. John's and/or Trinity are having their midweek lenten services for our members to attend if they wish.
- We will have one Ash Wednesday service at 7:00 PM.
- Installation of the church council members will be February 6th, 2022.
- Hailey Hughes made the motion to buy a Zoom subscription for the church for a year which will cost approximately \$150. Terri Lombardo seconded. The motion carried.

PROPERTY:

- It was suggested that we form a property committee again to discuss everything that needs done around the church.
- We will need someone to mow the lawn this spring and summer. We will start advertising for that in February.

INTERIM PASTOR'S REPORT:

- Pastor Goetze has put in 25 hours this past month and has made various visitations, phone calls, and prayers. He performed a funeral for Craig Joki. He led worship for 3 Sundays and on Christmas Eve.
- Terri Lombardo made the motion to accept the committee reports. Jodi Tammaro seconded. The motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS:


- We only needed 28 offering envelopes for 2022.
