

# **Council Highlights – November and December 2019**

- Action was taken to direct a tithe of the Election day bake sale proceeds to the Southwestern PA food Cupboard in Harmony, PA. They had recently suffered a failure of their cold-storage unit.
- The youth group continues to meet on a regular basis. They had a wonderful retreat at the Laurelville Mud Weekend.
- The Worship and Music Committee met and determined hymns through February 23, 2020. Services for Christ the King Sunday and The First Sunday of Christmas were discussed. These services will be different from the typical service.
  - A recommendation was made to council to change offering practice, such that the
    offering would remain in the sanctuary, placed on the altar, until the service has
    concluded. This recommendation was approved by council.
  - A recommendation was made to council for Christmas Eve, that Silent Night be sung in English only. This was discussed and not approved by council, as it is a significant tradition at Good Shepherd.
- An update concerning the soffit and fascia project was given. Although it was originally
  thought that this work could be completed in November, the contractor's schedule has not
  allowed for that. It is now expected to be completed in January 2020.
- An update was given concerning the boiler and situation with water usage. Caldwell
  Heating again added stop-leak to the system, to see if this could solve the problem in the
  short-term. This will continue to be monitored. Given the current situation and history over
  the last few years with this system, council will begin to think about next steps.
  - Action was taken to move any money that remains in the soffit & fascia fund, after completion of that project, to the Building Projects Fund.
- The Vision Committee proposed a new Shepherd's Center/Kitchen use policy for council approval. This policy along with a flow chart of the approval process to be followed were adopted by Council.
- The Vision Committee Recommended that Advent envelopes be directed to Ronald McDonald House along with December mission support. It was also recommended that mission support for Jan – Feb 14, 2020 be directed to the City Rescue Rescue Mission – Meal Kits and that Feb 14 – Mar, 2020 be directed to Lutherlyn for camp improvements. All of these recommendations were approved.
- Good Shepherd has registered with WPXI (channel 11) and KDKA (channel 2), to communicate cancellations of services or activities as GSLC due to weather concerns if necessary.
- We continue to explore options for snow removal.
- Church Council members will be installed on January 5, 2020. Thank you to all who will be serving on Council this year and thank you to those whose terms are ending, Theresa Andrews, Brian Johns, Curtis Johns, Jr., and Linda Marttala.
- The next Church Council Meeting will be January 14, 2020 @ 7:00pm.
