Vicar's Note

Dear Friends in Christ,

Give Thanks! A few weeks ago, as we were greeting each other after worship, someone said to me, "It's about an attitude of gratitude." Our gospel lesson that Sunday was from Luke chapter 17, where Jesus healed ten people afflicted with leprosy. One of them, the Samaritan, seeing that he was healed, turned back, praised God with a loud voice, prostrated himself at Jesus' feet, and thanked him.

As we enter into the month of November, many will celebrate and give thanks at a meal. This won't be the reality for everyone, however, as we live in world where hunger is reality. Recognizing the brokenness of the world, it may seem difficult to have an "attitude of gratitude." Or, it may seem that we are merely giving thanks for the blessings in our own lives, which is part of it. However, I am reminded of the words that are spoken as we come together for another meal.

As we prepare to come to the table for Holy Communion, the presiding minister invites all present to give thanks and words similar to these are exchanged, "Let us give thanks to the Lord our God; It is right to give our thanks and **praise.**" The presiding minister then follows with words similar to these, "It is indeed right, our duty and our joy, that we should at all times and in all places give thanks and praise...." (ELW, 129-130). In this meal at Christ's table, all are invited and there is always enough. It is certainly right for us to give thanks and praise, but did you catch those words, "at all times and in all places." It is not just about this meal, it is about all the gifts that come from God; our very beings, our lives, our salvation.

In our world it can be easy to focus on the negative and that can make an "attitude of gratitude" almost impossible. One of the things that I have found helpful is to look for at least one thing each day, for which I can say thank you. I invite you to do the same this month. Each day take a moment and give thanks to God.



Out of this amount, we have donated \$305 to Meals on Wheels. The rest of the money will be put in the General Fund. We also donated items to The Friends of the New Castle Library for their yard sale, jewelry to Passavant for their second-hand store for their residents, clothes and shoes to Goodwill, comfy blankets and sheets to the Lawrence County Humane Society, and the remaining treasures were given to New Bedford Presbyterian Church for their bazaar.

We will make some adjustments next year and price some larger items; so if you are worried we will only get a dollar for your valuable, you can still donate it next year, put a minimum price on it, and we will make sure that your wish is honored.

Council Highlights – Meeting held on October 8, 2019

A proposed budget was developed, which will be presented to the congregation for approval on November 10, 2019. The budget was created with consideration of compensation guidelines from the SWPA synod. There was discussion of how to present the budget, in terms of a full-time called pastor or in terms of a ½ time called pastor. The proposed budget is based on estimated cost for a full-time pastor with a total for 2020, including mission outreach, of \$136,255. This is \$2,527 less than the 2019 budget.

The congregational meeting will be held on November 10, 2019 following worship. In addition to consideration and approval of the 2020 budget, we will elect four members to 3-year terms on church council. The youth will coordinate a simple lunch. We will also provide an opportunity for fellowship, including games and cornhole.

We will celebrate the baptism and first communion of JJ Weber on October 20, 2019.

On Sunday December 22, 2019, we will have a Soup and Sandwich luncheon after worship.

Bids for the soffit and facia project were received from CVS (Creative Vinyl Systems) and Penn-Ohio Roofing and Siding, LLC. These bids came in at \$14,869 and \$16,805, respectively. While the bids were comparable in terms of quoted pricing, the Penn-Ohio bid excluded significant items from the scope of the bid. Several questions were outstanding concerning the CVS bid. It was determined that answers to these questions would be sought and a special council meeting would be held on October 13, 2019 after worship to review the answers and determine whether or not to move forward with CVS.

The vision committee is in the process of updating the Shepherd Center / Building use policy, based on the ELCA template. This will be presented to the council for final approval.

Reports were received from the Financial Secretary, Treasurer, Vicar Chris, and Pastor Peggy.

The next council meeting is scheduled for November 12, 2019 at 7:00 pm.

Special Council Meeting - Held October 13, 2019

This meeting was held for the sole purpose to review the answers posed concerning the CVS bid for the soffit and facia project and determine if we could move forward with CVS for this project.

Acceptable answers to the questions were received. A motion was made to award the contract to CVS, it was seconded, and the motion carried. Work on the project is expected to start in November.

Special Council Meeting – Held October 27, 2019

This meeting was held to review a request for use of the Shepherd Center. The request was made by Cory Miller to use the center for her granddaughter's birthday party on Saturday, November 16, 2019. She will not be using the kitchen and is expecting between 20 and 30 people.

A motion was made to allow Cory to use the Shepherd Center, following the current "Guidelines for Use of the Shepherd Center." The motion was seconded and carried.
